## **Highlight of Healthy Families Program in Portage**

#### Portage campus works to prevent infant mortality in Porter County

Healthy Families is our Portage-based program for new parents and infants in Porter County that helps fight infant mortality. The Healthy Families program works to identify families whose current life circumstances suggest that additional support could be helpful as they begin caring for their newborns.

Healthy Families' Resource Specialist screens and conducts initial outreach to prenatal and new mothers in Porter County hospitals as well as with families referred from other community programs. Our five Family Support Specialists offer follow-up home visits on a regular basis to eligible families.

Through a combination of information, support, and supplies, the Healthy Families team uses a variety of methods to help families keep babies safe and healthy, and their approach is working extremely well with a zero infant mortality rate in 2016 for program participants! Our rate is a vast improvement over U.S., Indiana, and Porter County as a whole. There have been about 1,200 cases of infant mortality in Indiana over the last two years (ranked 42<sup>nd</sup> in the U.S.). However, for Healthy Families' participants, statistics show that for the last 15 years, there hasn't been a single instance of

infant mortality (except one case for medical reasons associated with premature birth).

Our Portage facility is primarily used for the Healthy Families program, yet it can also be used to deliver clinical services to Portage clients more conveniently. It is also a designated Safe Place for teens in crisis who need safety or shelter.

The Healthy Families Program has been in place at FYSB since 1997, and our agency is recognized statewide and nationally as a leader in this type of programming.


## Survey Says...
