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
Program Highlight—Middle School Mentoring

One of the Family & Youth Services Bureau programs focused on middle school-aged children takes our Clinical Services team on the road to Valparaiso middle schools each week at lunchtime. The mentoring program brings students who are experiencing social isolation and awkwardness into a supportive setting focused on the children's strengths.

The Clinical Services team uses the nationallyaccredited and evidence-based program called Building Skills to work with the students. It has been proven to be effective reaching children which is not the case for many other mentoring programs. Students participate in enjoyable activities designed to bolster self-esteem and build social skills while eating together.

Participating in the Building Skills mentoring program isn't suited for every student. Some students choose to attend on their own, while others are identified as in need of additional support and skills by the guidance department.

Family & Youth Services Bureau has been offering this program for over ten years.



'I am so grateful to have the FYSB mentoring program available for our students. Students are eager to participate in this program every year. When our 7th graders who participate come to school the following year as 8th graders, one of the first things they ask me is when the FYSB lunch group will start. It has helped create an atmosphere and climate that has had an extremely helpful impact on our students who participate."




The Pick & Treat for Tots drive to replenish The Tot Shop relies on the generosity of area businesses that display our bins but we also get significant support from many area community organizations includ-
