New Education Option for Middle School Students


The Learning Place is a successful program because:

- It features a high ratio of staff to students.
- There is intense academic supervision and individualized instruction available for each student.
- It incorporates a behavioral system tied to both behavior and academic performance.
- Daily group and individual weekly counseling is part of the program for each student.
- The program requires parental involvement through teacher contact, groups and counseling.

This August, the Family & Youth Services Bureau is reviving a successful alternative education program for Porter County Middle School Students: The Learning Place.

It is a unique day treatment program with an effective behavior modification component coupled with a curriculum designed for at-risk middle school-aged students. The program is designed for those struggling with the traditional school expectations such as school attendance, academic achievement, or appropriate behavior.

The Family & Youth Services Bureau operated The Learning Place from 1977 to 2008. During that 30 years, nearly 500 Porter County students attended classes through this program and had the opportunity to learn new behaviors while continuing their education. In 2008 the funding sources for this type of program ceased and The Learning Place was closed. Due to a new funding source from the State of Indiana that will help offset expenses, The Learning Place was given new life and will begin operations again on August 19, 2015. The program will once again be available to youth in the community.



Dr. Ric Frataccia, Superintendent of Valparaiso Community Schools, recently commented at an educator's meeting "This program was one of the greatest programs for kids that can't be accommodated in a regular school setting. It was one of our community's biggest losses when Learning Place had to close."

Now, teachers and counselors at The Learning Place will again identify and provide comprehensive services and therapeutic support for younger adolescents and work with each youth to attain new skills and develop responsible ways of coping. Each day every student will also work with a curriculum developed specifically for their own needs and level, guided by licensed educators.

The Tot Shop is a unique store that doesn't take money....families with newborns and toddlers earn coupons that they exchange for diapers, educational toys, clothing, cribs, and other children's items, sizes infant through 5.

Parents earn the coupons by participating in activities like prenatal exams, parenting classes, well-baby check-ups, health screenings, and immunizations. Coupons are distributed at over 20 medical and social service locations in Northwest Indiana.

The Tot Shop is located at 257 W. Lincolnway in Valparaiso.

It is easy and rewarding to participate:

- Hold a baby shower at a specific time, or ask your group to bring in needed items during a designated time period.
- We are asking people to schedule this drive between October 1 and October 31; and we do accept new donated items all year.
- When you have collected the items from your friends, members or colleagues, you can drop them off at the Family & Youth Services Bureau office at 253 W. Lincolnway in Valparaiso or we can pick them up. If you would like someone to talk to your group about The Tot Shop and the Family & Youth Services Bureau, let us know!

The Family & Youth Services Bureau will ensure that no person shall be excluded from or denied participation in services based on the grounds of race, age, religion, sex, disability, national origin, ancestry, protected class, or any other protected class as defined by current law, or otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity that directly or indirectly receives state or federal support.

CASA Volunteer Training

Established in Porter County in 1990 by the Family & Youth Services Bureau, the CASA Program advocates for what is in the best interests of abused and/or neglected children. They save lives.

Every day in this country 1,900 children become victims of abuse or neglect, and four of them will die. Volunteer advocates— empowered directly by the courts—offer judges critical information they need to insure that each child's rights and needs are being attended to by relatives or while in foster care.

The <u>Court Appointed Special Advocate—also</u> known as the CASA volunteer—is assigned to work with a child who has been abused and/or neglected. After visiting with the child over a period of time, the CASA prepares a detailed assessment of the case and reports back to the court what is in the best interest of the child.

Our CASA program is beginning a volunteer training in September, and will also hold training sessions two or three times in 2016. Each 40 hour training session is completed over a several week period.
