CASA Program gives hope to neglected and abused kids

By the time you finish reading this article, more than 30 cases of child abuse will have been reported to authorities nationwide. By the end of today, that number will swell past 9,000. And four of those children will die at the hands of their abuser. All in a single day. We in Porter County are not immune to this kind of statistic; every day the volunteers and staff in our CASA program see children like this who are victims of abuse and neglect.

<u>CASA stands for Court Appointed Special Advocate</u>; these advocates are specially trained volunteers who look out for the best interests of the children assigned to them by the court. The number of Porter County children served *has grown from 183 in 2011 to 372 in 2016*. That is over <u>200% growth in only five years</u>. Also, the types of cases have changed as we now must deal daily with cases of opioid and heroin abuse, attempted suicide, and heartbreaking domestic and sexual abuse cases.

Children with CASA volunteers spend less time in long-term foster care, experience fewer out of home placements, and have significantly improved educational performance.

More than 90% of children with CASA volunteers never re-enter the child welfare system. This outcome also results in significant savings in child welfare expenses.

Are you someone who can make a difference in a child's life? CASA Volunteers come from many age groups and professions: construction, IT, educators, and retired people. Healthy Families Program educates young parents

The Healthy Families program prepares young families to be good parents and responsible community members.

Over 1,000 people are screened yearly to determine eligibility and the FYSB staff conducts home visits to over 250 families throughout the year for this program.

Healthy Families is a national program that seeks to identify families whose current life circumstances suggest that additional support might be helpful as they begin caring for their newborns. With virtually universal screening through hospitals serving Porter County residents and with the cooperation of WIC, the Porter County Public Health Department, area OB-Gyn practices and others, this voluntary program is provided at no charge to the families.

"The plan we develop with each family is tailored to their needs," states Melanie Dooley, Director of Prevention and Early Intervention Services. "One family may need help with daily living, such as information about housing or an energy assistance program, while another may want to study for a GED or take classes. We work with each family so that we can provide the best possible foundation for their young child."



The Healthy Families Program has been in place at FYSB since 1997, and our agency is recognized statewide and nationally as a leader in this type of programming.
